The French consume on average 27kg of cheese per person per year, and 30% eat cheese every day.

Last week we learnt about the fromager and his/her cheeses, and also how to cut the different types.

Today we tasted some of the well-known French cheeses, made from cow, sheep or goats' milk – **Camembert** “le champion du monde”, **Fromager d’Affinois** (soft and creamy), **Comte** (hard and nutty from the Jura mountains), **Roquefort** (classic blue mould cheese – a favourite of kings) and **Soignon Ash Chevre** (a roll of goat’s cheese).
